

Alan Pedersen has been performing for more than 25 years. An accomplished singer and award winning songwriter, he spent several years writing and recording music in Nashville, Tennessee. Alan has had several songs recorded by other artists. His writing has not been limited to music, he has written commercials, radio news copy, and collaborations for television shows and other comedy projects. His performing credits are numerous as well. Alan has worked as an actor, stand-up comedian, keynote speaker/emcee, and in radio as a network news and sports reporter for Westwood One Communications. Currently living in Englewood, Colorado, Alan is the father of two teenage boys and an angel.

In August of 2001 Alan's life took a tragic turn. His 18-year-old and only daughter Ashley was killed in an automobile accident. This tragedy would take his life in a direction he never imagined. Struggling for months to find answers and trying to cope with tremendous pain and anger, he entered a spiritually based grief program in Denver. He credits this program with saving his life, and inspiring him to honor his daughter's life by helping others. In July of 2003, Alan released a CD of songs he has written about his walk through the valley of grief, titled Ashley's Songbook. Alan now helps others by sharing his story of faith and hope. His message is simple; grief and loss offer the opportunity for ordinary people to accomplish extraordinary things. He believes that healing begins when we once again give of ourselves by helping others. Alan speaks and plays his music for churches and grief organizations around the country. In 2005 he is planning the release of a new music CD, A Little Farther Down The Road, and a book titled Growing Through Grief. THE NEW CD IS DONE - "More Songs from the Journey" is done, I hope this music blesses you. Thanks for all your support.

Thank you Pam and Mike Harris for gratiously speaking at our Candle Light Ceremony on December 9, 2007. Here is what Pam had to say:

Twenty three years, ten months, and five days ago my husband, Mike and I, had one of the happiest days of our lives. Our second son, Eric, was born. Then 19 years, 7 months and 8 days later we suffered the most devastating day of our lives when we were told our wonderful son had died, murdered by another. As most of you here know there is sometimes no way to describe or make others who have not gone through this experience understand the myriad of emotions you feel as you begin your journey down this dark, unknown road of indescribable loss. There we were two people who always seemed to be able to make intelligent decisions at a loss as to where to begin. Somehow we made it through those first days and managed with the help of friends and family to plan and have the memorial service for Eric.

Friends told us about Bereaved Parents and we decided within a month of losing Eric that we needed someone to help us through this trying time. We went to the first meeting we found, which was at the Ruskin Library. When we arrived at the library, much to our surprise, no one was there, but the library called Linda Delk and she came and was our first contact with Bereaved Parents. We knew that night that this was an organization that might help us cope with our grief. It has been 4 years, 2 months and 27 days since Eric left us behind. In that time we have had to deal not only with his loss and our grief, but also the trials of the two who murdered him. Throughout this trying period it has been a comfort to have a place to come to every month where everyone present understands exactly what you are going through.

A Keith Story:

When he was a teenager my wife struck a deal with our youngest son, Keith. She paid him in advance to rake the leaves at a later time. When that time arrived he was reminded of the agreement and sent to the chore.

Later, I went outside. A small amount of leaves had been raked into a pile or two. Keith was standing in the yard, rake in hand looking up as leaves trickled down. "What are you doing, Keith," I asked? "You're supposed to be raking leaves." He replied, "I'm waiting for all the leaves to fall."

Keith went ahead of us into eternity at age 42 in May of 2006.

Today, when most of the leaves have fallen and need to be raked, I look and see that yet others are drifting to the ground. I picture Keith standing in the yard, rake in hand, smiling at me knowing that now I understand what he meant when he answered those years ago.

Helping Survivors Survive

A death by any one of the many self-destructive ways, triggers great amounts of anger and guilt. However, some of those feelings can be balanced by struggling to see that the death was not so much a deliberate, hostile act, but a gesture of utter hopelessness and despair.

Reminders that the person was so driven by emotional whirlwinds that it was impossible to sense any ray of hope can temper, considerably, the emotional impact of self-destructive death.

One of the best responses to such a death that I have ever heard came through a sermon delivered by the pastor of a young man who recently had died a self-destructive death.

With great eloquence his pastor was able to convey tremendous hope through these words:

"Our friend died on his own battlefield. He was killed in action fight a civil war.


"He fought against adversaries that were as real to him as his casket is to us. They were powerful adversaries. They took toll of his energies and endurance.

"They exhausted the last vestiges of his courage, and only God knows how this child of His suffered in the silent skirmishes that took place in his soul."



Reservations must be made directly through the hotel. When making your reservations, ask for In House Reservations and inform them that you are attending the BP/USA Gathering so that you will receive the special discounted rate. RESERVATIONS MUST BE MADE BY JUNE 15, 2008 in order to take advantage of the discounted room rate. Rooms are available, at the same cost, for 3 days before and 3 days after the Gathering.
