

Grief Triggers

It occurred to me that a good part of traveling our journey is spent managing "grief triggers". In the beginning, after our child's death, life itself is a trigger. Just breathing and going through the motions of everyday life triggers the gutwrenching sadness and emptiness of life without our child.

Then as time goes on we start to notice that not every minute of the day is consumed by grief. We start to spend time crawling out of the pit of darkness into the light. We start to realize that we CAN live and that while even though we think of our child all the time we recognize the situations that "trigger" our grief. It may be seeing another child who reminds us of ours or discovering a picture of our child or a note or a video. At first these triggers completely take us off guard and throw us back in the pit.

But after awhile, we learn how to "manage" these triggers. Some of us avoid them altogether, such as not going to the cemetery or putting away the pictures. Some of us purposely look for the triggers because now we are strong enough to handle the emotion. Some of us cautiously make sure we always have a way out of a situation that might throw us into the grief pit. There is no one right way to manage the triggers of grief. Our journey is as individual as we are.

Whether you are facing your first holiday season without your beloved child or you have survived many celebrations, these can be difficult days. There is no way to turn back the clock to the "before my child died," neither can we jump into a month where we won't be faced with happy, intact families. Thanksgiving, Christmas, Hanukah, New Years Eve, they are a fact of life.

If possible, simplify your plans, but do have a plan. As you focus on the parts of these holidays that are important to you and your immediate family, you might find it is time for a change. Remember, you don't always have to do it the same way, with the same people.

Because we know how important this time is, our chapter has two special December events. Some parents enjoy buying gifts for needy children (Dec 5th Love Never Dies). Others plan to come to our Candlelight Celebration on Dec 14th with their extended families.

Are you planning your own family observance at your home, at the cemetery, or maybe at their favorite restaurant? Bake their favorite cookies and take them to a homeless shelter (or eat them all yourself!) One child's neighbors lined the street with luminaries. There are many ways of remembering.

You may find that your family and friends aren't able to help you at this time however. That hurts.

However you decide to observe these holidays, remember, they will soon be part of the past. Try to not give them too much power over today.

Ornaments of Grief

When astronaut James Irwin returned from space, he described what it was like: "The Earth reminded us of a Christmas tree ornament hanging in the blackness of space...that beautiful, warm, living object looked so fragile, so delicate, that if you touched it with a finger it would crumble and fall apart. Seeing this has to change a man, has to make a man appreciate the creation of God and the love of God."

Death forces us to look at a loved one through the empty black space of our grief. Alone and in despair, we naturally seek something that is familiar: a memory of happier times, a memory of our loved one: Planet Earth. The memory hangs in the darkness like a shiny bright ornament. Such "ornaments" can be seen only from a distance, mirroring the soul and reflecting the deepest regions of the heart. As the pain eases and grief subsides, the warm, loving memories multiply until the darkness disappears behind a sea of jeweltone "ornaments."

Like astronauts gazing at earth, we find comfort in memories. These special "ornaments" that hang in the darkness of our souls are fragile, too, as earth is fragile. Anger can break them; depression can hide their luster.

Hang your "ornaments" for everyone to see by placing photo albums of a loved one on the coffee table. Light a memory candle and place a blue ornament on the tree bearing your loved one's name. Fill the house with the sounds of your loved one's favorite music.



DEALING WITH HOLIDAY HEARTACHE IN A SEASON OF JOY

Christmas decorations in September and holiday music in October were not what my friend Alexandra needed. Alexandra's 6-year-old died four months ago, and her heart is still raw. She's been wondering how she'll cope without her daughter over the holidays -- just last year a time of joy and celebration.

Years ago, I anticipated the holidays would be tough. I'd wake on those cold mornings after Daniel died in February1997 and be grateful it was still months until his August birthday and even more months until Christmas. I dreaded living both days without my son. As those who had lost loved ones let me know, you have to live through it.

Christmas came. I did live through it. It continues to happen, as do the other significant days of the year. Here are 11 tips I've used and continue to use to survive the holidays. Some are my own suggestions and some are borrowed from the many who walk the path of grief.

- 1. Know you will survive. It will not be easy, but others have done it and you will, too.
- 2. Find someone you can talk to or meet with during the holiday season. Perhaps this person can give you helpful ideas that have worked for her.
- 3. Don't think you have to do the "traditional" activities of years past. Your energy level is low. If no one in your household minds, skip putting up the tree or spending hours making holiday cookies.
- 4. Spend the holidays with those who will let you talk about your loved one. You will need to recall memories, if you choose to do so. Your stories about your loved one are wonderful legacies. Tell them boldly again and again.
- 5. If going into the mall or stores brings too much pain, shop for gifts online or through mail-order catalogs. Thinking everyone is happily shopping at the malls while your heart is crushed is terribly tough.
- 6. Getting away from the house worked for my family. The first Christmas without Daniel we went to a nearby town and lived in the Embassy Suites. The kids enjoyed the indoor pool and breakfast buffets.
- 7. Create something to give to those who have helped you throughout the year. I made some very simple tree ornaments with "In Memory of Daniel" stamped on them and gave them to friends that first Christmas.

- 8. Decorate the grave. Sometimes being busy with decorating the grave gives a feeling of doing something for a child we can no longer hold.
- 9. Do something in memory of your loved one. Donate to a charity. Volunteer. My oldest daughter Rachel and I volunteered at the Hospice Tree of Remembrance and shared memories of Daniel as we spent this time together.
- 10. If your bereavement support group has a special candlelighting service, attend it. Doing something in memory of your loved one with others who understand the pain can be therapeutic.
- 11. Spend time reflecting on what the season is about. Everyone around you may be frantic with attending parties, services, shopping and visiting relatives. Give yourself permission to excuse yourself from them. Light a candle in your favorite scent. Record some thoughts in a journal. One day you will wake up and it will be January 2. The holidays will have ended. You will have made it.

If you are like me, you will find that surviving the tinsel has made you stronger, and although you may cry, somewhere within you, you will feel that core of new steel.
